Art. 1.1 Preamble

This Rally will run in compliance with the FIA International Sporting Code and its appendices, the 2024 Motorsport Ireland Yearbook and these Supplementary Regulations. The National Road Traffic Regulations shall apply. Unless provided otherwise by these Supplementary Regulations, the provisions of the above Rules and Regulations shall apply.

Any modifications, amendments and/or additions to the Rules and Regulations shall be made in the form of numbered and dated bulletins.

The various documents will be written in English. In case of any discrepancy the English text will be binding.

A change of competitor is permitted up to the close of entries. **Only the competitor entered in the event will be allowed to make this request**.

An entry application (also made electronically) will be accepted only if accompanied by the total entry fees. According to the International Sporting Code Art. 3.8.1 an entry compels the competitor to take part in the Competition in which they have been accepted to run, except in case of duly established Force Majeure.

Motorsport Ireland accepts an equivalence between National and International Licences issued by Motorsport Ireland (and Motorsport UK) for drivers and co-drivers. Competitors with licences issued by ASNs other than Motorsport Ireland and Motorsport UK, must hold an International Licence of the appropriate grade.

Art. 4.3 Number of competitors accepted and vehicle classes

The number of competitors shall be limited to:160 (including Historic/excluding Juniors). No more than 25 junior cars will start at the beginning of Leg 2.

Competitors are reminded that FIA ISC 2.7.1.c permits Groups A, N, R & RGT cars (unless there is an indication to the contrary on the homologation form excluding certain evolutions) to participate in international rallies for a period of eight (8) years following the expiry of their homologation, provided homologation papers are presented at scrutiny and the car complies with them.

Art. 4.3.2 Eligible National Cars

Nationally homologated cars may participate in this rally when they fit into a national group/class per the following list.

Cars in classes 9-15, class 20 and class 23 will compete for the Galway International National Rally Cup.

Cars in classes 17-19 will compete for the Galway International Historic Rally Cup.

Cars in class 16 will compete for the Galway International Junior Rally Cup.

Cars in classes 22, 24 and 25 will only be included in overall classification and are eligible for overall awards.

Class 9. Modified cars up to 1450cc – 2-wheel drive.

Class 10. Modified cars 1451cc to 1650cc not more than 2 valves per cylinder, 2 wheel drive.

Class 11F. Modified FWD cars 1451cc to 1650cc more than 2 valves per cylinder.

Class 11R. Modified RWD cars 1451cc to 1650cc more than 2 valves per cylinder.

Class 12. Modified cars 1651cc to 2100cc not more than 2 valves per cylinder, 2-wheel drive.

Class 13. Modified cars 1651cc to 2100cc more than 2 valves per cylinder, 2- wheel drive.

Class 14. Modified cars 2101cc to 3500cc, 2 wheel drive. (Max 2 valves per cylinder over 3000cc actual capacity).

Class 15. Four-wheel drive cars whose homologation has expired.

Class 16. For cars complying to the Class 16 technical regulations published on the Motorsport Ireland website where the driver is under 26 years of age on Jan 1st of the year in which the event takes place.

Class 17. Historic cars up to 1600cc. See Appendix 29.1, Article 18.2. of current Motorsport IrelandYearbook.

Class 18. Historic cars over 1600cc. See Appendix 29.1, Article 18.2. of current Motorsport Ireland Yearbook.

Class 19. FIA Appendix K.

Class 20. Modified 4 Wheel Drive Cars.

Class 22. For cars whose homologation expired on or after Dec 31st 2004 and do not meet the criteria laid out in Art. 2.7.1.c of the FIA International Sporting Code. WRC cars are not eligible for this class -.See Appendix 29.1, Article 13 of current Motorsport Ireland Yearbook.

Class 23. Novice Class See Appendix 29.1, Article 23 As per the technical regulations published on the Motorsport Ireland website.

Class 24. R5/Rally2cars converted from left hand drive to right hand drive. All other components must comply with the cars homologation.

Class 25. WRC Cars (1.6T & 2.0T), including those converted from left hand drive to right hand drive. All other components must comply with the cars homologation. Cars in this class must meet the criteria laid out in Art. 2.7.1.c of the FIA International Sporting Code.

Historic competitors in classes 17, 18 & 19 will start the event at start of Leg 1 TC A Parc Fermé Out. Class 16 Juniors competitors will start the event at the start of Leg 2 from Parc Fermé Out.

Notes on Classes: See Appendix 29.1 (Rally Car classes and Specifications)_of the current Motorsport Ireland Yearbook. Historic cars in classes 17, 18 & 19 must have an HRVIF or HTP (as appropriate) which must be produced at scrutineering.

Art. 4.6 Entry fee refunds

The entry fee shall be refunded in full

- if the event does not take place
- to teams whose entry application is rejected

The organiser may partially refund entry fees, if a competitor cannot take part in the event due to a duly proved case of force majeure.

Art. 5. Insurance Cover

Motorsport Ireland licence holders must hold current IRDS cover, valid for 2024 in order to be permitted to start the event. All other licence holders must hold current BRDS Insurance Cover, valid for 2024 in order to be permitted to start the event.

The Motorsport Ireland Insurance Database Listing published and updated weekly on www.motorsportireland.com is the only proof that valid IRDS/BRDS is held by a competitor.

Each Co-Driver not in possession of their own IRDS/BRDS must sign a declaration stating that at no time during the event, will he/she drive the competing car.

IRDS/BRDS Cover will commence on arrival at Scrutiny Out Control before Parc Fermé In control on Friday 2nd of February 2024.

- (a) Cover only exists while travelling the Official Route, i.e. via the Road Book during the course of the competition and while under the control of the Organisers.
- (b) Cover will cease on arrival at the Final Parc Fermé In Control or at the point where the competitor(s) retire from the Event.

The Organisers decline liability in any accident caused by or to competitors and the competing cars during the whole of the event. The Organisers also decline any liability for breach of the laws and regulations of the countries covered by the rally. Competitors shall be held entirely responsible for any accident or breach of laws in which they may be involved and shall declare to the Organisers particulars from any accident from which liability may arise and shall indemnify the organisers in regard to any liability. An entrant or driver(s) shall have no claims against the Organisers arising out of any action of the Organisers, their servants or officials, during the course of the rally.

Art. 6. Advertising and Identification

Art 6.1 Obligatory organiser's advertising

Rally plate: Number and Event/Sponsor Logo

Competition number size: 50 x 50 cm including Sponsor Advertising.

The organiser will provide each crew with the number identification (50x50cm), which must be affixed to their car in the stated positions prior to scrutineering. Each panel shall be placed horizontally at the leading edge of each front door, with the number at the front. The top of the plate shall be between 7 cm and 10 cm below the lower limit of the window. **It is not allowed to cut the panel.**

Art. 7. Tyres

Art. 7.1 Regulations regarding tyres which may be used during the rally

All cars must comply with Motorsport Ireland tyre regulations. The hand cutting of tyres is permitted but must be in accordance with the patterns submitted by the tyre manufacturer to the FIA.

Art. 8. Fuel

All types of fuel must follow Appendix J Art. 252. See Art 12.7 regarding Refuelling Zone.

Art. 9. Reconnaissance of Special Stages

Reconnaissance will be according to the current Motorsport Ireland Yearbook. The schedule for the reconnaissance is published in Appendix 2 of these supplementary regulations.

Art. 9.1 Registration procedure

Details of the reconnaissance car and occupants, including address and telephone numbers at which they can be contacted during the reconnaissance period, must be submitted to the organisers at recce registration at the Rally Office. A Recce Registration form will need to be completed by all competitors. If the crew making a reconnaissance wish to change the car or vary the occupants, a new Recce Registration form will need to be completed.

Each car must be identified with a reconnaissance car number supplied by the organiser. Rally cars used in the event may not be used for reconnaissance.

- (a). Competitors must sign on each day between 08.00 to 12.00 at rally headquarters.
- (b). Competitors must declare the make, model and registration number of the car that they will be using for reconnaissance. All recce cars must comply with Appendix 29 Article 4 of the current Motorsport Ireland Yearbook.
- (c). Entrant Decals supplied by the organisers, must be displayed clearly on the windscreen of the car during the reconnaissance period. These plates must be returned to the Secretary before 19:00 on 2nd February 2024. Fine of €100.00 for non-return.
- (d). Any competitor found on a special stage without having registered as above, or in breach of these registration regulations, will not be permitted to start the rally.

Art. 9.2 Specific regulations

During reconnaissance, all national traffic regulation must be followed, including but not limited to the speed limits. Please note that the Special Stages will not be closed to public traffic during reconnaissance. The organizer may reduce the allowed speed individually by marking the areas in the road book and along the route .Speeding during reconnaissance will be penalised according to Appendix 29 Article 4.6.2 of the current Motorsport Ireland Yearbook.

Art. 9.3 Number of Passages

The maximum number of passages authorised for each crew on each special stage is three.

Art. 10. Administrative checks

Art. 10.1 Documents to be presented:

To keep the time required for the administrative checks to the necessary minimum, make sure to bring and present the following documents:

- Competitors' licence
- Driver's and co-driver's competition licences
- Driver's and co-driver's ID cards/passports
- Driver's and co-driver's valid driving licences
- ASN authorisation for foreign competitors (if required)
- Completion of all details on the entry form
- Completed Scrutineering Sheet or electronic equivalent if in operation
- Car registration papers

Art. 11. Scrutineering, Sealing and Marking

Art. 11.1 Scrutineering, venue and time.

International / National Competitors

Upon completion of Scrutineering, Cars must immediately proceed to Parc Fermé

Cars may be presented at scrutineering by a representative of the team.

Art. 11.1.1 Scrutineering, mandatory documents

- Cars' complete certified homologation (RC2 RC5, Class 22, Class 24 and Class 25)
- SOS/OK board (DIN A3 format)

For each car of the **FIA Priority Drivers**, one spare gearbox and one set of spare differentials (front and/or centre and/or rear) may be used in each rally. These spare components and those fitted to the car will be marked/sealed at initial scrutineering. These cars must have their sump guards removed for sealing of gearboxes and differentials and be kept with the car for the purpose of weighting.

The installation of the safety tracking system will be checked at scrutineering.

Art. 11.1.2 Timetable for scrutineering

Individual Scrutineering Times will be published in a Bulletin delivered on Sportity App, Password "GIR2024".

Art. 11.3 Windows

Use of tinted windows is not authorized in accordance with Article 253.11 "Windows/nets" of Appendix J of the FIA International Sporting Code. ASN rules apply to National Cars.

Art. 11.4 Drivers' safety equipment

All items of clothing including helmets and FHR (Front Head Restraint) intended to be used, e.g. HANS devices, must be presented for scrutineering. They shall be checked for compliance with Appendix L, Chapter III.

Art. 11.5 Noise Level.

Cars must comply with Motorsport Ireland regulations - Appendix 2. Art 9

Art. 11.6 Special National Requirements

Competitors in the National classes 9 to 25 must comply with the technical regulations contained in Appendix 2 and Appendix 29.1 of the current Motorsport Ireland Yearbook.

Art. 11.7 Installation of the Safety Tracking System

Safety Tracker System equipment will be distributed prior to scrutineering – details of distribution and fitting instructions will be detailed in a Bulletin via the Sportity App. The safety tracking System must be installed in the car prior to scrutineering and the fitting will be checked at scrutineering.

Art. 12. Other procedures and regulations

Art. 12.1 Shakedown

There is no Shakedown stage on this Event

Art. 12.2 Ceremonial start procedures and order

There will be a Ceremonial Start.

Ceremonial Start will be Eyre Square, Galway on 2nd February 2024 at 19:30hrs. Invited Cars and Arrival time will be published in a Bulletin delivered via the Sportity App, Password "GIR2024".

Cars will arrive from Parc Fermé and return to Parc Fermé.

Art. 12.3 Permitted early check-in at the following Controls:

Parc Fermé In at end of Day 1

Parc Ferme In at end of Day 2.

Art. 12.4 Start procedure on Special Stages

The electronic start procedure is as follows:

Start Intervals will be 30 seconds.

Start Time is issued by Start Timekeeper

30 seconds before start, Red Light shows on Start Board.

15 seconds before start, Red Light and 5 Amber Countdown Lights show on Start Board

5 seconds to 0 seconds Amber Countdown Lights reduce by 1 every second

Start is Green Light.

Finish is determined by competitor breaking a beam whilst travelling over the Finish Line. The Finish Time is automatically transmitted to the Stop Car where the Finish Time will be Issued.

Art. 12.5 Super Special Stage.

There will not be a Super Special Stage.

Art. 12.6 Tyre Warming Zone (TWZ)

There will be no Tyre Warming Zones.

Art. 12.7 Refuelling

Art. 12.7.1

All competitors may refuel in the Service Area or at commercial filling stations with the exception of the ITRC International Registered competitors. ITRC International competitors must arrange their fuel through Euro M Sport, as per ITRC Championship Regulations. Non ITRC International Championship competitors may also arrange their fuel through Euro M Sport if they wish.

Non ITRC International Championship competitors are allowed to use their own refuelling systems. However, the use of plastic canisters is forbidden. Only metal drums or metal containers may be used.

Art. 12.7.2

ITRC International Registered competitors and any other competitors using the fuel supplied by the ITRC Fuel supplier must use the designated Refuel Zone (RZ) and follow the instructions of the fuel supplier.

Art 12.7.4 Penalties:

Art 12.7.4.1 Failure to comply with these refuelling regulations will be reported to the Stewards and penalties may apply.

Art 12.7.4.2 Each crew is responsible for the actions of their service crew and any breach of these regulations.

Art 12.4.3 No access is permitted to the Refuel Zone (RZ) with the exception of the competitors availing of the refuel rig. These competitors must exit the car while refuelling is in operation and they must follow the instructions of the

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refuelling operators.

Art. 12.8 Finish procedures and other activities after the finish of the rally

Art. 12.8.1 Finish Ramp will be at Rally HQ and attending cars may be held at a holding control nearby. Details in Roadbook and amendments by Bulletin if necessary.

Art. 12.8.2 Availability of participants

Participants who park their vehicles in the Parc Fermé upon passing the finish line, must remain available by phone (mobile) until the final classification has been posted.

Art. 12.8.3 Classification

The final classification will not be distributed after the event. The final classification will be published on the event website and on the Digital Notice Board via the Sportity App.

Art. 12.9 Official time used during the rally

Official Time throughout the Rally is that of GPS. Time Zone is GMT+1.

Art. 12.10 Rights of Organisers

The organisers may at their discretion: -

- (a). Refuse any entry without giving a reason.
- (b). Offer an applicant whose entry is refused, a reserve entry.
- (c). Refund any entry fee or excuse a competitor payment of an entry fee in circumstances other than those defined in Article 4.6.
- (d). Abandon, cancel, or postpone the competition in the case of unforeseen circumstances.
- (e). Delete or amend any part of the route, competition, or time requirements in the case of unforeseen circumstances.
- (f). Distribute the awards at their discretion, if through unforeseen circumstances the competition is stopped before its scheduled completion.
- (g). Reduce the number of awards in any class.
- (h). Exclude any person or car appearing on examination to be ineligible for the competition or the class therein, to which the entry refers.
- (i). Before the start of the competition offer the entrant of any person or car liable to exclusion under Paragraph (h) above the option to transfer to the appropriate class.
- (j). Exclude a competitor from the rally and refuse his application for entry for the following 3 years for contravention of Article 9.
- (m). Appoint Judges of Fact to determine whether or not the requirements of these regulations have been complied with. In particular, these judges will be empowered to determine whether a competitor has followed the correct route, and /or travelled at an excessive speed, and or caused an excessive noise and /or obeyed instructions concerning servicing and service areas. Appendix 29 Art. 3.3 & Art. 11 of the current Motorsport Ireland Yearbook

Art. 12.11 Super Rally

12.11.1: General

The rally will operate Super Rally in accordance with Art 13, Appendix 29 of the current Motorsport Ireland Yearbook.

RE-START AFTER RETIRING ON LEG 1: 12.11.2

A crew retiring from the rally between Parc Ferme Out and Arrival Control of SS2, may restart the rally from Service Out Control after 2 stages, or Service Out Control after 5 stages or from Overnight Parc Fermé Out Control on Sunday (subject to compliance with 12.11.9.1 below).

A crew retiring from the rally on Special Stages 2, 3, 4 or the following road sections, may restart the rally from Service Out Control after 5 stages or from Overnight Parc Fermé Out Control on Sunday (subject to compliance with 12.11.9.1 below).

Crews retiring from the rally on Special Stages 5, 6, 7 or 8 or the following road sections, may restart from Overnight Parc Fermé Out Control on Sunday morning (subject to compliance with 12.11.9.1 below).

If they are unable to re-start at Service Out Control after Special Stages 2 or 5, they must have their car in Parc Fermé not later than 22.30 hours on Saturday night. They may then restart, subject to passing scrutiny, on Leg 2 at Overnight Parc Fermé Out Control (Sunday morning) if they are to continue to be classified in overall results (subject to compliance with 12.11.9.1 below).

Galway International Rally 2024

RESTART AFTER RETIRING ON LEG 2: 12.11.3

A crew retiring from the rally between Parc Fermé Out (Sunday morning) and Arrival Control SS10 may restart the rally from Service Out Control after 10 stages or from Service Out Control after 12 stages (subject to compliance with 12.11.9.1 below).

A crew retiring from the rally on SS 10 or SS11 or the following road sections and Arrival Control SS12, may only restart the rally from Service Out Control after 12 stages (subject to compliance with 12.11.9.1 below).

No restart will be permitted for crews retiring on Stages 12, 13 or 14.

A restart will not be permitted where a crew has been excluded for non-compliance with eligibility requirements, traffic violations or a decision of the COC / Super Rally Co-Ordinator.

On retirement the crew must hand in their time-cards to Car Accountability or the marshal/timekeeper at the next available location/Time Control.

Crews must retain the duplicate copy of the time-card, to present to SRC as proof of stages completed

- 12.11.4 Competitors must register for Super Rally if they wish to restart by contacting the SRC prior to a time that will be specified in event Bulletins. Service Vehicles will not be permitted to access the Stage or any closed road between runs. The organisers will, where possible, endeavour to remove any car to the nearest location where it can exit the stage. The transport of the car from that location is the responsibility of the competitor. The car must return by direct route to the Service Area.
- **12.11.5** Competitors availing of the Super Rally must present themselves at the appropriate Out Control, with their car, for re-scrutiny. Due time is 10 minutes before their original due time at that Control, and 15 Minutes maximum lateness will apply.
- **12.11.6** The SRC, once satisfied that the crew meets the conditions for a restart, will issue new time cards which will have a restart time and restart Control Number.

The restart position within the field shall be at the discretion of the COC/ SRC.

12.11.7 The organisers reserve the right to disallow restart on safety grounds or if the restart would interfere with the running of the rally.

12.11.8 Penalties:

12.11.8.1 Super Rally Penalties will be applied as per Article 13.5, Appendix 29 of the current Motorsport Ireland Yearbook.

12.11.9 Award Eligibility:

12.11.9.1 In order to be classified as a finisher the crew must complete a minimum of 7 special stages (or 50% of the total number of stages Junior Classes), which must include the final loop of stages and the finish control. **12.11.19.2** Crews completing the rally under Super Rally regulations will be eligible to score points in Championships.

Art. 12.12 Bogey Times

Bogey times will be enforced as per Motorsport Ireland GCR 22.2.1The maximum required average speed for loose surface stages shall not be more than 113 kph and for tarmac stages 130kph, as per GCR Chapter 2, Rule 22.2.1.

Art. 13. Identification of officials

Art. 14. Prizes

- 1. All awards will be presented to the first nominated driver unless otherwise specified in the details of the awards hereafter. It is a condition of receiving any award, prize, or trophy, that the first driver is present at the prize giving, unless having given prior notice in writing to the organisers, he has been excused, in which case he must also nominate a person to collect the award at least one hour before official prize giving time. Otherwise he will forfeit his award.
- 2. Entrants wishing to compete for particular awards other than the General Classification, Group, and class awards must claim for such awards in his entry form. The organisers shall have absolute discretion accept or reject any such claim, and in cases of doubt may call for proof in support of any claim. Any claim deemed to be false will entail exclusion.

Art. 15. Final checks / Protests / Appeals

Art. 15.1 Final Checks

Time and location: see programme (SR. Art. 3)

Any teams required to undergo final scrutineering must immediately follow the instruction of the marshals in charge, even if this prevents them from proceeding to one or more time controls (TC). The complete original FIA homologation form and other necessary certifications must be available for final scrutineering. A representative of the competitor as well as mechanics with the appropriate tools (in case of dismantling) must be present at the final scrutineering.

Art.15.2 Protest deposit

The protest deposit is:

EUR 500

If a protest requires the dismantling and re-assembly of a clearly defined part of the car, any additional deposit will be specified by the Stewards upon a proposal of the Chief Scrutineer.

Art. 15.3 Appeal deposit

The appeal deposit for an international appeal is: **EUR 2,000**

All protests and/or appeals must be lodged in accordance with Motorsport Ireland GCR's Articles 13 and 15 of the Code and, where applicable, with the FIA Judicial and Disciplinary Rules.


